

# *Experience Grey County's* Waterfall Tour

**Feel** as the river flows over the edge of the  
**the** Niagara Escarpment. Visit Grey County's  
**Rush** 7 waterfalls and enjoy a short walk or an  
extended hike. Start your tour at Grey Roots: Your Heritage  
and Visitor Centre near Inglis Falls, then follow the scenic  
Waterfall Tour through forested uplands and across  
valley floors.

## **Indian Falls (6 kms)**

Indian Falls descends 15 metres over the Niagara Escarpment. Located in a 12 hectare Conservation Area, there are also washrooms and a children's playground. Follow the 0.8 km rugged pathway to view the horseshoe-shaped falls named for the local Nawash people.

### **Directions:**

Follow the scenic Georgian Bay Route from 2nd Avenue West to Grey Road 1. Look for Conservation Area sign directing you west to the parking area.

## **Jones Falls (16 kms)**

Jones Falls is a 12-metre waterfall, cascading over the Niagara Escarpment's limestone surface. Located in the Pottawatomi Conservation Area near the Chi-Cheemaun Information Centre, the Conservation Area is host to extensive hiking trails and connects to the Bruce Trail. Follow a well-marked one km trail to view the falls.

### **Directions:**

Located on the west side of the city of Owen Sound. Follow 10th Street West to Springmount. Turn north on Highway 6. Entrance is on the immediate right. Parking available.

## **Inglis Falls (26 kms)**

Inglis Falls is located in 180 hectares of the Inglis Falls Conservation Area. The falls descend 18 metres to the Sydenham River. In 1845, Peter Inglis built a grist mill, and the remains are still observed below the falls. The Conservation Area supports all-season activities including cross-country skiing/ hiking trails and connects to Harrison Park. Seasonal facilities, picnic pavilion, and parking available.

### **Directions:**

From Springmount, follow Grey Road 18 south, continue on Grey Road 18 east. Signage will direct you to the entrance of the Inglis Falls Conservation Area.

## **Walter's Falls (51 kms)**

Walter's Falls is located on private property, but is accessible from a viewing platform where Walter's Creek spills over the cliffs' edge dropping 14 metres to the valley floor. The waterfalls were originally home to an old lumber and wool mill that was functional until the early 1980's.

### **Directions:**

Follow Grey Road 18 east to Grey Road 29 south, through the hamlet of Bognor where it heads east to Walter's Falls. The falls are found at the end of Front Street.

### Eugenia Falls (106kms)

Eugenia Falls is one of the highest waterfalls in Ontario dropping 30 metres. The falls hosted 5 mills, and was the site of Ontario's second hydroelectric plant. It is located in Eugenia Falls Conservation Area - 23 hectares of parkland with hiking trails, washrooms and a picnic pavilion.

#### Directions:

Follow Grey Road 40 east to Grey Road 7 south, through Fairmount and Epping, into the Beaver Valley. Catch Grey Road 13 south to Eugenia. The entrance to Eugenia Falls is diagonally across from Eugenia Falls Emporium.

### Hoggs Falls (116kms)

Hoggs Falls are Grey County's best-kept secret. Tucked in amongst vibrant foliage, the Boyne River tumbles 7 metres over these falls. Despite the short drop, these waterfalls are breathtaking due to their huge volume.

#### Directions:

Take Highway 4 West (from Grey Road 13) to East Back Line north. Turn east on Lower Valley Road. Watch carefully for two yellow posts on the north side of the road which mark the trail entrance. Limited roadside parking only.

### McGowan Falls (150kms)

McGowan Falls are located in the Durham Conservation Area. The falls are typically slow moving, but have cut a beautiful gorge through the limestone bluffs and provide unsurpassed scenery.

#### Directions:

Durham is located at the junction of Grey Road 4 and Highway 6. To access McGowan Falls, watch for George Street East on the north side of Grey Road 4 and proceed to the well signed parking area. The main entrance to the Conservation Area is off Durham Road East.
